Hawaii Superferry had the privilege of welcoming aboard Hawaii Fi-Do Service Dogs, a non-profit organization that trains assistance dogs to provide support to those who face the daily challenges of life with a disability other than blindness.

Started in 1999, Hawaii Fi-Do is run by volunteers and is the only certified training center of its kind on O'ahu, specializing in training skilled dogs for autistic children.
